2017-18 SCENE APPLICATIONS NOW OPEN

The SCience and ENgineering Experience (SCENE) offers high-achieving high school sophomores, juniors and seniors the opportunity to gain exposure to cutting-edge science research.

Under the guidance of ASU faculty and student mentors, these students work in labs at Arizona State University, using state-of-the-art facilities and equipment to answer their own original research questions and compete in regional and national science competitions.

Students will do background work during the fall semester (reading, learning about experimental design, lab equipment, and lab techniques) and ultimately decide on a question to investigate.

During the spring semester, students conduct research and present their findings to their peers within the SCENE group. Eligible students will have the opportunity to compete in the Arizona Science and Engineering Fair.

REGENERON SCIENCE TALENT SEARCH

The Regeneron Science Talent Search (Regeneron STS), a program of Society for Science & the Public (Society) is the nation's most prestigious science research competition for high school seniors. Since 1942, the Society has provided a national stage for the country's best and brightest young scientists to present original research to nationally recognized professional scientists.

As the new school year approaches, we thought you might know a few students with great research project (from any year of high school) who deserve to be recognized for their work, and might be interested in a top prize of \$250,000. Interested students, and teachers, should [sign up here](#) to learn more.

The application opens on August 1, and will remain open until November 15, 2017 at 8pm ET. Three hundred entrants will be named scholars and will receive \$2,000 each; 40 finalists will be named, awarded \$25,000 each, and will be invited for a week long competition in Washington, DC in March of 2018. PERRY OUTREACH PROGRAM ANNOUNCED



We're very excited to announce an upcoming Perry Outreach Program on Saturday, September 30, 2017 at Mayo Clinic Arizona in Phoenix, AZ. The Perry Outreach Program is a free, one-day, hands-on experience for high school and college-aged women who are interested in pursuing careers in medicine and engineering. Students will hear from women leaders in these fields and try it for themselves by performing mock orthopaedic surgeries and biomechanics experiments.

We are now seeking applicants for our Phoenix program. Participants should be women in grades 10 and up with an expressed interest in science, medicine and/or engineering. We would very much appreciate if you could pass this information along to any high school principals, high school science teachers or high school students you may know. Applicants should be directed to fill out our online application in advance of the August 30, 2017 application deadline.
