Parent Chaperone's Needed

Field trip season is upon us and we are in need of chaperones. The district has changed the process for chaperone approval.

Every chaperone/volunteer must repeat the process annually, even if the chaperone is a district employee and/or certified teacher. The current turn around time for continuing applications is ~2 weeks.

Regarding HOSA, please reach out to Mrs. Landreville to confirm that you are an approved 17-18 candidate. The district will deny our field trip paperwork if the listed chaperones are not preapproved.

Engineering Seniors completed their solar oven designs and experiments. They are continuing to work on their senior projects before learning about Big Data and Quality Engineering Management.

Crest Juniors are also working on their big projects and last minute shopping lists. 3D printing is in motion, and a little sawing and drilling have also begun:)

The sophomores in the engineering strand are learning Statics and refining their math skills by solving forces in truss systems. They will complete the unit by testing material properties using compression and tension to determine the failure point of different materials in multiple configurations.

Freshman Honors Stem Collaborative students have investigated a problem, designed a solution; developed a budget and timeline. They are beginning to create prototypes and interact with stakeholders.

Crest Freshmen are working diligently on finding a problem, researching the problem, coming up with a solution, designing and building. They are now on the design and build phase, just finishing up with shopping lists and any last minute items they may need.

VEX/SkillsUSA robotics meets on Mondays in Startech room 10 and is looking for some more members to help out before our first competition in January.

First Tech Challenge

First Tech Challenge, or FTC, is a new club focused on teaching STEM principles by solving complex challenges using robotics. In FTC you will have the opportunity to learn engineering, electrical, and computer science principles and apply them, building robots from scratch to participate in a challenging game. This year's game is called Relic Recovery, and involves sorting blocks into specific patterns to score points while you and your alliance partner work to defeat the other team.

All students are welcome and no previous knowledge is required to get involved. The FTC team meets every Tuesday and Wednesday in Mr. Vivers room after school from 2:10 PM to 4:00 PM. We'd love to have you come join us for a meeting if you're interested in engineering and robotics. Join us for our 2017-18 build season!

Message from Computer Science:

The AP Computer Science class is doing well, exceeding expectations. They have mastered an introductory course in machine learning and artificial intelligence (something only universities such as MIT, Stanford, and Carnegie Melon offer).

The students are now able to solve practically any problem in any field by designing a neural network (the same technology that Google, Amazon, Netflix, etc. are using).
